Sow: Plant cloves in October or February – autumn-planted garlic is generally bigger. Plant up to 4 inches deep.

Soil: Rots in heavy soils, so add sand and organic matter before planting if you are on clay. Dislikes heavily manured soil: try adding some bonfire ash before planting.

Sun: Full sun.

Grow: Snip off loop-the-loop flowerheads.

Harvest: When the lower leaves turn yellow, pull up and leave to dry in the sun for 10 days. Then remove the outer layer of skin before storing in a cool place.

**Problems**: Onion white rot, a furry white mould, can devastate the crop bed for eight years. Rust can weaken the plant in severe cases.
