

Soil: Plenty of well-rotted manure before planting. Can grow on a compost heap.

Sun: The sunniest part of the garden.

Grow: Plant out in final position, 2ft apart, once frosts have passed. Feed once a fortnight with comfrey tea.

Harvest: When the fruit is around 4-6inches long. You can also eat the male flowers (these do not have baby courgettes at their base).

Problems: Protect plants from slugs with cloches until stems and leaves are too tough to eat. Powdery mildew may weaken plant towards end of a dry season.
